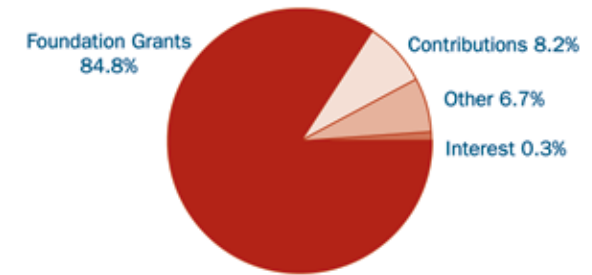

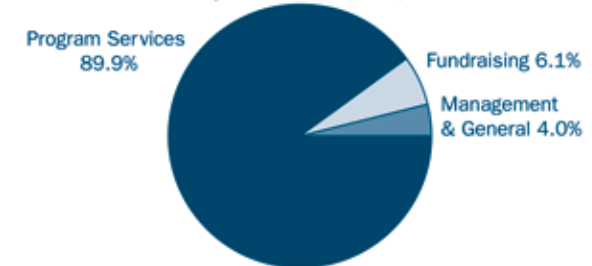
REVENUE

2010 ACHIEVEMENTS

POLICY

Advancing a Just and Humane Immigration System: Legislative and Administrative Advocacy

- Pushed legislators and policy makers for reform in overall immigration law, appropriations, border enforcement, interior enforcement policies, and naturalization efforts.

Reforming Immigration Enforcement

- Continued to play a crucial role in presenting policy makers with recommendations for just and fair enforcement of the immigration laws, included reforming the detention system and ensuring that due process was followed in immigration courts and in all enforcement programs.

Achieving Safer Borders

- Worked with local and state organizations to facilitate their participation in the national conversation on border policy and security.

Improving Funding for Immigration Programs: Budget and Appropriations

- Continued to influence key decision makers to improve funding allocation for immigration-related priorities and prevent the misallocation of funds.

Promoting Immigrant Integration

- Through the Naturalization Working Group, continued progress on immigration fee reform and increasing appropriations for immigration services.

- Managed and chaired the [largest immigration reform campaign](#) in history! Organized actions across the country, including the largest gathering on March 21st at the National Mall where over 250,000 people gathered in support of immigration reform.

- Organized members of Utah's community to sign the [Utah Compact](#), a set of principles that address the complex challenges associated with immigration reform.
